

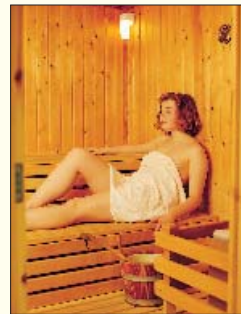


The indoor pool is open from 7.00am until 7.00pm daily, together with the sauna and jacuzzi.

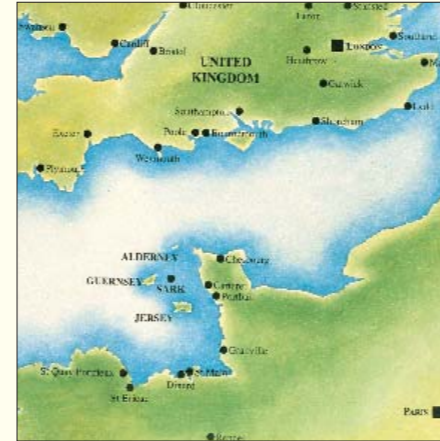

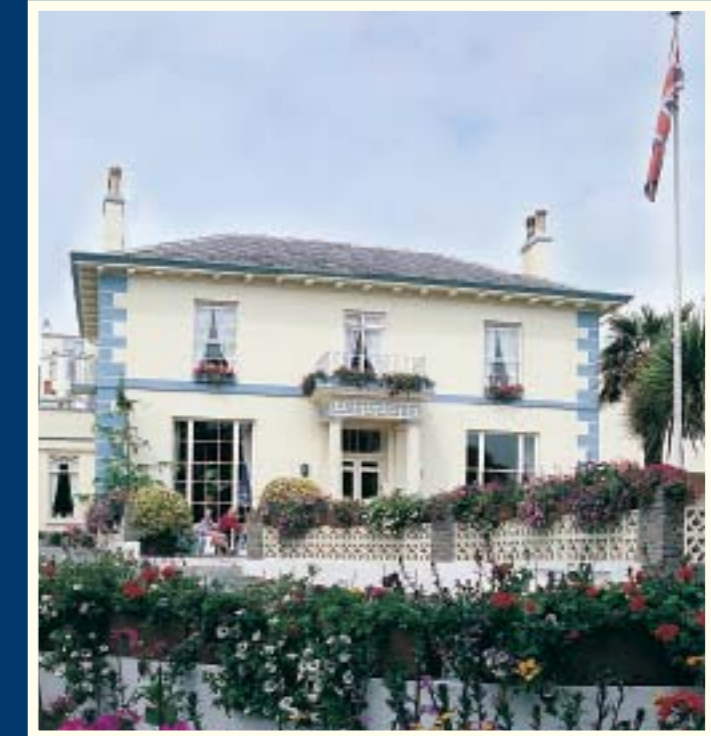

RESTAURANTS



Guernsey has often been described as a gourmet's paradise and the two restaurants at De Havelet count among the islands best. The Wellington Boot, the Havelet Grill and the Saddle Bar are all to be found in the converted coach house. Why the Wellington Boot? Legend has it that Henrietta, daughter of the Le Marchant family, enjoyed a liaison with the Duke of Wellington before her hurriedly arranged marriage to a Captain de Courcey, and it was the Duke who ordered the rebuilding of part of the house. The Wellington Boot is now a non smoking restaurant popular with residents and locals alike.

The Havelet Grill is a more informal eating place specialising in fish and seafood and charcoal grills. Guests on half board may also dine here, and an allowance is given for those who wish to do so. A dinner exchange scheme also allows guests on Half Board to dine at one of the other hotels in our group.
